6. N.J.S.A. 18A:12-24.1 Code of Ethics for School Board Members

The President will read aloud the following code of ethics which applies to all School Board Members:

School Board Members shall abide by the following Code of Ethics for School Board Members:

I will uphold and enforce all laws, rules and regulations of the State Board

of Education, and court orders pertaining to schools. Desired changes

shall be brought about only through legal and ethical procedures.

I will make decisions in terms of the educational welfare of children and

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will seek to develop and maintain public schools that meet the individual needs of all children regardless of their ability, race, creed, sex, or social Standing.

I will confine my board action to policy making, planning, and appraisal, and I will help to frame policies and plans only after the board has consulted those who will be affected by them.

I will carry out my responsibility, not to administer the schools, but, together with my fellow board members, to see that they are well run.

I will recognize that authority rests with the board of education and will make no personal promises nor take any private action that may compromise the board.

I will refuse to surrender my independent judgment to special interest or partisan political groups or to use the schools for personal gain or for the gain of friends.

I will hold confidential all matters pertaining to the schools which, if disclosed, would needlessly injure individuals or the schools. In all other matters, I will provide accurate information and, in concert with my fellow board members, interpret to the staff the aspirations of the community for its school.

I will vote to appoint the best qualified personnel available after consideration of the recommendation of the chief administrative officer.

I will support and protect school personnel in proper performance of their duties.

I will refer all complaints to the chief administrative officer and will act on

the complaints at public meetings only after failure of an administrative solution.

c. That the firm of AHERA Consultants, Inc., Oceanville, NJ be appointed Board of Education asbestos consulting service until the next reorganization meeting, at fees negotiated for each individual project, at the following hourly rates: \$70 for asbestos inspector and \$100 for project designer.

d. That the firm of KSI Consulting Engineers, LLC, Farmingdale, NJ, be appointed Board of Education engineers until the next reorganization meeting, at fees negotiated for each individual project, at the following hourly rates: \$220 for principal consultant and \$165 project manager/senior engineer. e. That the firm of Wilentz, Goldman & Spitzer, P.A., Woodbridge, NJ, be appointed Board of Education bond counsel until the next reorganization meeting, at fees negotiated for each individual project, at the following hourly rates: \$170 for attorney time.

f. That Dr. Michelle Mayer, Woodcliff Lake, NJ be appointed Board of Education school physician until the next reorganization meeting, at the yearly fee of \$10,000.

g. That Dr. Shawn Trokhan, Closter, NJ be appointed Board of Education school athletic physician at PVHS until the next reorganization meeting, at the yearly fee of \$3,000.

h. That Dr. Oscar Vazquez, Hoboken, NJ be appointed Board of Education school athletic physician at PHHS until the next reorganization meeting, at the yearly fee of \$3,000.



WHEREAS, Section 7 of the Opening Public Meetings Act (N.J.S.A. 10-4-12) permits the exclusion of the public ("Executive Session") from a meeting of the Board in certain circumstances; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that circumstances exist for such an Executive Session; and

WHEREAS, the Board has found the action described below to be necessary and proper;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board on the date indicated above that:

- 1. The public shall be excluded from discussion of and action on the Executive Session herein set forth.
- 2. The subject matter to be discussed is as follows: Possible HIB
- 3. If needed, the subject of executive session will be stated in the verbal motion
- The Board will not return to the Regular Board Meeting, will take no action, and will adjourn from executive session. OR
- 5. Official action may or may not be taken when the board reconvenes to Public Session
